We remember fondly when Amie became the Tallahassee Mall's first female Santa Claus. The headline in the Democrat read: "Santa is a G-I-R-L!" When her children were at Florida High, she was known as The Cake Lady.

Pre-deceased by her parents, grandparents, Erling and Kristine Holmen, and William and Emilie Mohr, the true love of her life Vic Leamon, and nephew, David G. Powell, she leaves behind to cherish her memory her daughter, Dineka Bradley Keen (Davis Booth), and son Clayton Allen Bradley. Her cherished grandchildren will never forget their beloved Grammie: Bradley Gay (Scout Garren) Taylor Gay (fiancé Luke Moyer), Danelle Keen, Evie Bradley and Baylee Booth. 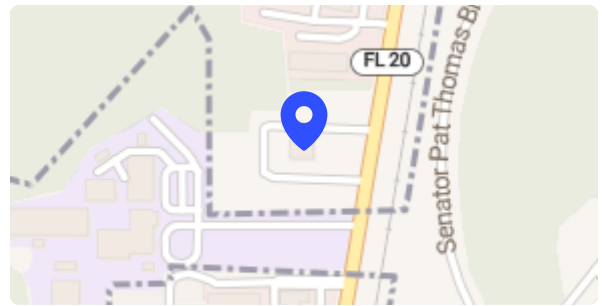
